Commander's Message

I doubt the families of the victims of terrorist attacks in San Bernardino and Paris enjoyed their Christmas. There is a dark cloud over the free world. The highway signs "If you see something, say something." are a reminder of potential terrorist dangers.

Wounded Warriors Get to Play in Snow

Lithuanian Post 154 member Kirk Bauer, a wounded warrior who lost his left leg to a grenade in Vietnam, has been the Executive Director of Disabled Sports USA (DSUSA) for over 30 years. For a week starting November 30, he accompanied 800 participants to the 28th annual *Hartford Ski Spectacular* at Breckenridge Ski Resort in Colorado. The week-long event is the nation's largest winter sports festival for individuals with physical disabilities.

DSUSA serves over 100 community-based chapters in 37 states that participate in over 30 different sports. Disabled Sports USA's mission is to provide national leadership and opportunities for individuals with disabilities to develop independence, confidence, and fitness through participation in community sports, recreation and educational programs.

"Among nearly 800 participants were more than 150 wounded warriors and their families, many of which tried snow sports for the first time. Wounded warriors came directly from Walter Reed National Medical Center, Brooke Army Medical Center, Naval Medical Center in San Diego, Tampa VA, and all across the country. All military participants and family members participated at no cost through DSUSA's Warfighter Sports program that has served more than 9,300 severely wounded warriors and family members since 2003."

Boys State Applications Available Now

Maryland Boys State 2016 will be held at McDaniel College, Westminster, Maryland from Sunday, June 19 thru Saturday, June 25.

The American Legion Boys State is among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for high school students. To be eligible for Boys State, a youth must be a male who has successfully completed his junior year in high school by the beginning of Boys State. Participants learn how a democratic government should work, through classroom instruction and by becoming a part of the operation of their Boys State local, county and state governments. The boys will hold elections to determine where participants will serve in various offices in Boys State governments. During the week-long event, attendees will reside in a McDaniel College dormitory. In some respects, it will be like a mini basic training experience that we went through when we joined the US military. Participant activities will include exercise, classroom lessons, legislative sessions, court proceedings, law enforcement presentations, and assemblies...as well as band, chorus and recreational programs.

The student Lithuanian Post 154 sponsored in 2015 told us he learned more Civics during that one week at Boys State than he had in 11 years of school.

Henry Gaidis Awarded Lithuanian Military's Highest Civilian Medal

The formal establishment of Lithuania's modern armed forces on November 23, 1918 is now celebrated as a notional holiday in Lithuania. Because the Lithuanian Minister of Defense, Juozas Olekas, was in Washington for meetings with US defense officials, the Lithuanian Embassy chose to celebrate the establishment of Lithuanian Armed Forces Day this year on November 17th. Over a hundred guests including diplomats from other embassies and US officials were invited. The Lithuanian Embassy also invited Henry Gaidis, American Legion Lithuanian Post 154 Historian, who frequently submits articles about events in the Baltimore-Washington Lithuanian community to Lithuanian newspapers and magazines. Henry was asked to attend the establishment of Lithuanian Military celebration and write an article for *Draugas*, an English language Lithuanian newspaper.

To Henry's surprise, in the midst of the formal proceedings, Henry was called to the podium and was presented with the National Defense Service of the Republic of Lithuania Medal for Meritorious Civilian Service (Lietuvos Respublikos krašto apsaugos sistemos medalis civiliams "Už nuopelnus"). This medal is the highest decoration bestowed by the Lithuanian National Defense Service to civilians for extraordinary merit and exceptional performance in strengthening Lithuanian national defense over the period of many years and for dedication while conducting civilian service.

Henry Gaidis has been active in Baltimore's Lithuanian Community all his life. He is on the Board of Directors of Lithuanian Hall and is the Curator of the Lithuanian Museum on the 3rd floor of Baltimore's Lithuanian Hall. He is a collector of Lithuanian military armaments, historic documents and medals. Annually, he displays his collection and shares his knowledge of Lithuanian and European history with attendees of Baltimore's Lithuanian Festival.

Henry also serves on the Board of Directors of the Joint Baltic American National Committee (JBANC) representing the Lithuanian American Council. The Joint Baltic American National Committee has, with one voice since 1961, been advocating the interests of Estonian, Latvian and Lithuanian American communities to US legislators and administrations. JBANC played a significant role in obtaining support in the US Congress for the independence of the Baltic States and their admittance into NATO. Due to Russian aggression in Georgia and Ukraine, all three of the Baltic States have requested increased NATO presence in their nations. Henry's long association with the JBANC was a significant factor in selecting him for this prestigious decoration.
