Back to God Mass



Our Lady of Victory Church

Lithuanian Post 154 continued its annual Back to God Mass program at Our Lady of Victory Church in Arbutus on Sunday, November 12, 2023. Fr. Bill Keown introduced Post 154 to Our Lady of Victory parishioners and thanked us for our participation at the mass. After mass, Lithuanian Post 154 members and their families met for lunch and socializing in Catonsville.

How did the Back to God Mass get started? American Legion in the 1950s took a strong McCarthyist stance. There was an anti-Communist "crusade" to discourage Communist influence and bring the American people closer to God. The American Legion, consistent with the Legion's purpose as stated in its Preamble to The American Legion Constitution that begins with "For God and Country..." at its 1951 convention in Miami, Florida, formally endorsed a "Back to God" movement in a resolution. Prompted by the American Legion's endorsement, Lithuanian Post 154's "Back to God Mass" was started by Father Dranginis in 1953. With only a few exceptions, it has been held every year since.

During his radio broadcast on February 7, 1954, President Eisenhower made the nation aware and strongly endorsed the American Legion "Back to God" program. He said "As a former soldier, I am delighted that our veterans are sponsoring a movement to increase our awareness of God in our daily lives. In battle, they learned a great truth--that there are no atheists in the foxholes. They know that in time of test and trial, we instinctively turn to God for new courage and peace of mind. All the history of America bears witness to this truth."

The American Legion's National Commander in 1952, Lewis K. Gough, promoted "regular church attendance, daily family prayer, and the religious training of children." Also, The American Legion endorsed the passage of state bills requiring U.S. loyalty oaths of school teachers. Something that would certainly be challenged in our courts today. We are living in a different country.

Germany to Deploy Troops in Lithuania

German Defense Minister Boris Pistorius and his Lithuanian counterpart, Arvydas Anusauskas, signed an agreement on Dec. 18, 2023 to permanently deploy a brigade of German soldiers in Lithuania. The decision, described by Pistorius as "historic," represents the first permanent deployment of German troops abroad since the end of World War II.

The deployment of a brigade, consisting of close to 5,000 soldiers, will begin in 2024 and reach full strength in 2027. The move aims to strengthen NATO's presence on its eastern flank with Russia, which is the "duty of Germany to protect," Pistorius said.

Also, on 18 December, the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Lithuania, Gabriel Landsbergis, met German Defence Minister, Boris Pistorius. During the meeting, Landsbergis noted that the deployment of the German brigade in Lithuania was the priority of the Lithuanian Government and therefore attempts were made to ensure the best conditions for German troops and their families.

Patron of City of Vilnius Medal

Vilnius City Council awarded the title of "Patron of the City of Vilnius" to Lithuanian Post 154 Historian Henry Gaidis last July in appreciation of the Lithuanian military collection he donated to the Lithuanian National Museum in 2021. The collec-



tion containing thousands of items and is valued at over \$400,000. Since he was unable to travel to Vilnius at that time to receive the award and medal in the formal setting, they arranged for the medal to be presented to Henry at the Lithuanian Embassy on Sep 18, 2023 by Lithuanian Ambassador Audra Plepytė. The "Patron" title is granted to individuals who have made significant contributions to enhance the city of Vilnius. The collection is currently on display in a wing of the Lithuanian National Museum in Vilnius.

Boys State Applications Available Now

The American Legion 2024 MD Boys State Program will be held at McDaniel College, Westminster, Maryland from June 16 to 22, 2024 (date and location are subject to change). The program is a Nationally recognized program in leadership, government, and political sciences. Tuition for the program for accepted Boys is fully funded by The American Legion, Department of Maryland Posts. Lithuanian Post 14 will sponsor boys recommended by Post members.

Detail information about the program and application can be found at www.mdlegion.org/boysstate. The application has to be submitted on-line.

The program's aim is to expose current high school juniors to the United States Constitutional form of government. Experienced instructors at Boys State offer the students an opportunity of a lifetime to immerse themselves into the creation of a government among equal citizens selected from the finest young men in high school. The challenge to create a functioning City and State government allows the young men to focus their talents in areas seldom explored in a normal classroom environment. Presenters include politicians and elected leaders from the local and State levels of government, and many special interest topics to young adults. Highlights of the week include a trip to the State Emergency Management Agency, sports, and political simulations, along with City, State, and National elections, where 2 young men will represent MD at Boys Nation in Washington, DC.

Having graduated from Boys State is an excellent addition to the boys professional resume and college application and is a highly coveted entry on applications to Service Academies.

Attendees at MD Boys State have 2 exciting opportunities offered by McDaniel College. For a small fee (rate for 2024 to be determined) any graduate of MD Boys State can receive 2 College Credits for the week from McDaniel College by completing a few requirements. Also, McDaniel College is offering MD Boys State 2024 graduates that are accepted and enroll in McDaniel Collage for the Fall 2025 semester \$10,000 per year (\$40,000) for four years in scholarship funds. Boys who attend Boys State in 2024 and meet Samsung requirements may apply for the Samsung Scholarship grant, which last year amounted to \$1,100 for our State winner. There is an opportunity to receive up to \$20,000 in the Samsung Scholarship if selected as the National winner. During the week-long event, attendees will reside in a McDaniel College dormitory. In some respects, it will be like a mini basic training experience that we went through when we joined the US military. Participant will learn how to live together sharing a room and work together to accomplish shared goals. Boys State is not a rest and recreation camp. It may be the hardest work the candidate has experienced. The experience in the program will test the boy's ability to participate and adapt to a structured environment.

Use of tobacco, vaping, or use of contraband at Boys State is not allowed. The boys will not be allowed to bring distractions such as electronic equipment including but not limited to cell phone, computers, iPods', etc. The boys are not to bring reading material (other than religious), food, candy, gum, knives, stuffed animals, etc. The boys will require someone to bring them to bots State and pick them up after graduation on June 22nd. The boys will be exhausted after a week of long intensely active days and will be too tired to drive. Most likely they will fall asleep in the car a few minutes after being picked up.

If you know of a boy who will finish his junior year of high school this summer who would like to attend, ask him to go to The American Legion Department of Maryland website http://www.mdlegion.org/boysstate and click on "Apply Today" button. Applications have to be submitted by May 1, 2024.

There is a companion program named MD Girls State at Salisbury State University during the same dates conducted by The American Legion Auxiliary for young women completing their Junior year in high school. A link for more information about the program and an application is also on www.mdlegion.org/boysstate. Collage credit and scholarship opportunities mentioned above also apply for MD Girls State. Though Lithuanian Post 154 no longer has an Auxiliary, the Post will pay the tuition for girls recommended by Post 154 members to Girls State.

Please ask the boy or girl to print and send a copy of their completed application to Vincent Dulys so that Post 154 could pay American Legion Department of Maryland Legion or Auxiliary the tuition.
